Confocal image of a *Drosophila* brain. The mushroom body, also known as the fly learning and memory center, is marked in green in addition to the optic lobe, while DNA is staining in teal, and nc82 staining is shown in magenta. Flies utilize visual cues to process information regarding the parasitoid wasp, followed by expression of learning and memory genes in the mushroom body in order to remember wasp exposure.
